

English

Pupils will be taught to:

- Develop an understanding of Spelling punctuation and grammar with a focus on word class, tenses, use of suffixes and tenses.
- Develop positive attitudes to reading and understanding of what they have read by listening to and discussing a wide range of fiction, poetry and non- fiction.
- Understand spelling patterns and learn the spelling of common exception words and apply these patterns within their spellings.
- To develop of nonfiction type of writing looking at Biographies, newspaper reports and diary entries.
- Discuss the content of books that they have read and answer comprehension questions about them.

Mathematics

Pupils will be taught to:

- recognise place value of each digit in two-digit numbers
- compare and order numbers using $<$, $>$ and $=$.
- solve problems using place value and number facts.
- Develop written methods to add and subtract numbers up to 4 digits .
- Develop written methods to multiply and divide numbers
- Identify and recall multiplication and division facts
- recognise, find, name and write fractions $\frac{1}{3}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{2}{4}$ and $\frac{3}{4}$ of a length, shape, set of objects or quantity
- write simple fractions for example, $\frac{1}{2}$ of 6 = 3 and recognise the equivalence of $\frac{2}{4}$ and

$\frac{1}{2}$

Science

Pupils will learn about Forces and Magnets. Then Rocks.

- observe how magnets attract or repel each other and attract some materials and not others. Will explore what is magnetic
- Compare the different kind of rocks, learn how they are formed and in simple terms understand how fossils are

History

The children will learn about:

- Howard Carter as significant individuals in the past who have contributed to national and international achievements.
- Using Ancient Egypt as non-European society that provides contrasts with British history.

Art and Design

Pupils will learn:

- Explore print making, using Egyptian hieroglyphics as inspiration.
