

English

Pupils will be taught to:

- Spell common exception words, the days of the week and months of the year
- write from memory simple sentences
- become very familiar with key stories, traditional tales, retelling them and considering their particular characteristics and recognising and joining in with predictable phrases
- predicting what might happen on the basis of what has been read so far, making inferences on the basis of what is being said so far.
- Read words with contractions eg, I'm, we'll, I'll
- Phase 4 and 5 letters and sounds and beyond. Begin to recognise alternative sounds for graphemes. Read words containing common suffixes. Read books matched to their improving phonic knowledge.
- Using the prefix, un, using ing, ed, er and est where no change is needed to the root word.

Mathematics-Multiplication, number bonds, subtraction and properties of shapes.

Pupils will be taught to:

- To recognise, describe and name common 2D and 3D shapes, eg, Eg, Identifying 2D shapes on the surface of a 3D shape(circle on a cylinder and a triangle on a pyramid.
- Compare and sort 2D and 3D shapes.
- Count read and write numbers to 100 in numerals, count in multiples of two, fives and tens.
- solve one step problems involving multiplication and division, by calculating the answer using concrete objects, pictorial representations and arrays with the support of a teacher.
- Describe position, direction and movement by using mathematical vocabulary to describe position, direct and movement.
- To subtract one digit and two- digit numbers to twenty, including zero
