

English

Pupils will be taught to:

- apply their growing knowledge of root words, prefixes and suffixes
- become increasing their familiarity with a wide range of books, including myths and legends.
- check that the text makes sense to them, discussing their understanding and explaining the meaning of words in context
- organise paragraphs around a theme in narratives, creating settings, characters and plot.
- describe settings, characters and atmosphere and integrating dialogue to convey character and advance the action in narratives

Mathematics

Pupils will be taught to:

- compare and order fractions whose denominators are all multiples of the same number
- identify, name and write equivalent fractions
- add and subtract fractions with the same denominator
- recognise and write decimal equivalents of any number
- interpret and present discrete and continuous data using appropriate graphical methods, including bar charts and time graphs.
- solve comparison, sum and difference problems using information presented in bar charts, pictograms, tables and other graphs.

Science

Pupils will be taught to:

- Compare and group materials together, according to whether they are solids, liquids or gases
- Observe that some materials change state when they are heated or cooled, and measure or research the temperature at which this happens in degrees Celsius (°C)
- Use knowledge of solids, liquids and gases to decide how mixtures might be separated, including through filtering, sieving and evaporating

History

The children will learn about:

The achievements of the earliest civilizations -where and when the first civilizations appeared and a depth study of Ancient Egypt.

Art and Design

Pupils will learn:

- Print making-Explore patterns and shape and how they can be recreated.

Physical Education Gymnastics

Pupils will learn to:

- To balance using different parts of their bodies
- work co-operatively to create sequences
- to understand the compositional principles of sequencing and recognise when something is absent.

Personal, social and health education

Pupils will learn to:

- develop and maintain a variety of healthy relationships, within a range of social/cultural contexts

Religious Education

Pupils will learn about:

- Identify ways in which the Qur'an provides guidance to Muslims about how they should live their lives.

Computing

Pupils will learn to:

- Choose an appropriate tool to collect and record data
- Use logical thinking, imagination and creativity to extend a program.
- Know that anything posted online can be seen, used and may affect others.

Geography

Pupils will learn to:

- use fieldwork to observe, measure and record the human and physical features in the local area using a range of methods, including sketch maps, plans and graphs, and digital technologies.

Music

Pupils will learn to:

- Read some musical notation and develop skills to play the ukulele
